Over 300 years ago, conquistadors traveled halfway around the world to find someone who did Cuban tobacco justice. A Spanish galleon brought to the Philippines two hundred ounces of tobacco seeds from Cuba. The climate and soil of the Rio Grande de Cagayan Valley, combined with the care and zeal of the missionaries, proved ideal for bringing to fruition the finest tobacco. From this tobacco the missionaries hand-crafted fine cigars that have been acclaimed by aficionados ever since.



When the tobacco monopoly in the Philippines was dissolved by government edict in 1881, all the original cigar producers were united. A large new factory was built and named *La Flor de la Isabela* after the flower of Isabela, the choice leaf grown in the province of that name. So the Tabacalera cigars of today are direct descendants from a tradition of excellence that began in the early days of the conquistadors, who knew a good thing when they smoked it.
